

Elizabeth Nesmith Clump Award

At the Region 4 Summer meeting the Elizabeth Nesmith Clump Award will be presented to the Owner(s) of a tour garden for the most impressive daylily clump seen that was hybridized in Region 4. The daylily must have been hybridized in Region 4, be named and registered with the AHS and have been introduced during the previous 15 years by a Region 4 hybridizer still residing, or deceased while residing in, Region 4.

"Clumps" are defined as 5 or more fans. Up to 10 eligible daylily clumps can be identified in each tour garden. Please see the attached list of eligible cultivars that you elect to represent in your garden. The clumps must be clearly labeled for easy identification by meeting attendees. At this summer's Regional tour clumps will be identified with the \$ ever Daylily logo on a bamboo pole. All Regional meeting attendees are eligible to vote. Region 4 funds the award which is chosen by the host club.
